Anatololacerta budaki - Budak's Rock Lizard

Budak's Rock Lizard is basically a Turkish species. However, on the small Greek islet of Psomi in the Kastellorizo Archipelago, a population of Anatololacerta was discovered by Greek scientists. First, it wasn't sure to which species those lizards refer. But in 2018, genetic analysis revealed that they are conspecific with their cousins on the Turkish mainland: Anatololacerta budaki - the first and so far only record of this species in Greece.

As the population on Psomi is the only one known in our area, this species could actually be regarded as Europe's rarest Lacertid. (We will not discuss here whether the Kastellorizo Archipelago belongs to Europe - Just ask any local Greek, if you want to know...)

Lizards of this population show a darker basic colouration as the closely related $\underline{Anatololalcerta}$ pelasgiana. They are rather uniform brownish.

Their habitat is a karstified limestone islet with some sparse shrubs on top.

As it is the only Lacertid on this islet, it cannot be confused with other species.



In our area, Anatololacerta budaki only occurs on a small islet of the Kastellorizo Archipelago.
